

Malnutrition and Dehydration in older people

Malnutrition and dehydration are major causes and consequence of poor health in older people. It is estimated that, in the UK, 3 million adults and 1 million older adults over the age of 65 years are malnourished or at risk of malnutrition.

As part of Adult Safeguarding Week the GM Nutrition and Hydration Programme is convening a virtual roundtable discussion on **19.11.2020 - 11am – 12pm** with adult social care staff, safeguarding specialists and older people to explore the relationship between malnutrition and safeguarding

Female Genital Mutilation

Recognising and Preventing FGM Elearning

The Home Office have produced an eLearning package that is now available via the <u>Stockport councils</u> <u>learning pool</u>. Click on the link and search FGM and the course links you to the home office page.

The duration of the course is approximately 1 - 2 hours - You do not have to complete all the training in one session and can proceed as quickly or as slowly as you like. After completing all of the training material you will receive a certificate of achievement.

Significant Incident Notifications/Child Safeguarding Practice Reviews

In Stockport we have seen quite a reduction in the number of significant incident notifications; and we wanted to ensure that all practitioners were aware of the criteria and the process for notification and referral.

Below sets out the local process for notifications and rapid reviews.

There is a duty on local authorities to notify serious incidents to the National Child Safeguarding Practice Review Panel.

A decision about whether an incident is serious should be made using the definition set out in Working Together 2018: 16C (1) of the Children Act 2004(as amended by the Children and Social Work Act 2017) states:

Where a local authority in England knows or suspects that a child has been abused or neglected, the local authority must notify the Child Safeguarding Practice Review Panel if – (a) The child dies or is seriously harmed in the local authority's area, or

(b) While normally resident in the local authority's area, the child dies or is seriously harmed outside England.

Notification must always be made if abuse or neglect is a cause of, or a contributory factor to, the serious incident or where it is suspected. *Whilst it is the Local Authority that carries this duty to report, partners are under a duty to inform the safeguarding partners of any incident that they think may meet these criteria.*

The duty to notify all serious child safeguarding incidents within the current timescales of 5 working days remains in place.

Rapid Reviews - It is acknowledged that not all Rapid Reviews may be achieved within the current timescales of 15 days. It is expected that all partners should make decisions locally on how quickly a rapid review could be undertaken. However it is advised that where there is a child death or serious injury in the context of neglect, abuse or where Covid-19 is a strongly related factor, a review should be held. Within Stockport, the current process for referring and initiating a Rapid Review remains the same. (This is accessible on the SSCP Website). All referrals will be screened by the Virtual Panel and if a decision is taken to progress a review, this will be done virtually.

Safeguarding Adult Reviews (SARs)

The statutory duties in relation to adult safeguarding reamins the same throughout the pandemic.

It is important that you continue to raise safeguarding concerns in-line with the standard SSAB policy and procedure. Safeguarding Adult referrals also remain unchanged and referrals can be sent by email to: lsb@stockport.gov.uk

The three statutory partners will continue to undertake threshold screening upon receipt of a SAR referral. They will decide based on the information received whether to initiate a SAR panel.

Greater Manchester Safeguarding Adult Review (SAR) Policy

We are excited to announce the release of the Greater Manchester Safeguarding Adult Review (SAR) Policy.

In the last few months, we have been working with colleagues at Tameside to develop guidance to assist local safeguarding boards on good practice when responding to a SAR referral. The aim was to have a Greater Manchester approach with a framework that provides consistentcy within each of the boroughs that local safeguarding boards can apply when commissioning a SAR. The guidance also contains useful templates that local areas can adopt if they choose to.
