## **Stockport Safeguarding Children & Adult Boards - Training Matrix**

This matrix describes the training expected by the Stockport Safeguarding Children & Adult Boards at different levels. This matrix is in addition to those competencies and standards laid out in any relevant single agency documents and is intended to supplement rather than replace those. Courses with an \* are under review in light of the new Safeguarding Adults Policy due for release in 2021.

The matrix focuses on issues local to Stockport including the 5 thematic priorities of the Boards for 2020-2023 which are:

- Neglect, including Self-Neglect - Implementation of LPS - Transitions - Safe Sleep - Homelessness

| Essential | As an extension to the communications approach taken by board and individual agencies, this level is generally considered as a follow on for members of the community who have seen some information about safeguarding and want to learn more. This level also applies to the public sector workforce who, whilst not employed in a health or social care role, have face to face contact with children, families and potentially vulnerable adults and therefore have a responsibility to contribute to Safeguarding Children and Adults.
